Gracie's Parents, Family & friends have bravely led a campaign for action against Stalkers and as well all know is not a easy task, but they have continued the campaign for the Love and passion they have for Gracie and safeguard to others.

Gracie's friends and family described her as a fun loving, caring person who was always the one who brightened up any Party. As well as her love for Horses, she was always the first one to pick up the microphone to sing and entertain at family and other events.

Gracie worked for Chesterfield Borough Council as a Lifeguard at Queens Park & Staveley Healthy Living centres, where once again she showed her caring and passionate nature of helping others. Gracie was a swimming instructor who taught many children how to swim and keep safe in water, including my Step Granddaughter where me , Dawn & family will be forever grateful.

For a number of months now I have been in touch with Gracie's Parents & family to seek their approval of the footpath leading from Tom Lane Duckmanton, to Poolsbrook Country Park named after her.

Since that approval from the family I held several months of talks with Chesterfield Borough Council officers together with Derbyshire County Council Highways and Rights of way officers together with Our Town Clerk for guidance.

It gives me great pleasure to be involved with this, where it shows when we work together with other authorities we can achieve good for our community.

The proposed footpath, known locally as 'The Yellow Brick Road' was chosen as it is a popular route for horse riders. After consultation with Gracie's Parents I found that this footpath was one of Gracie's favourite rides, and why shouldn't it be when the journey leads you to the beautiful settings in Poolsbrook Country Park.

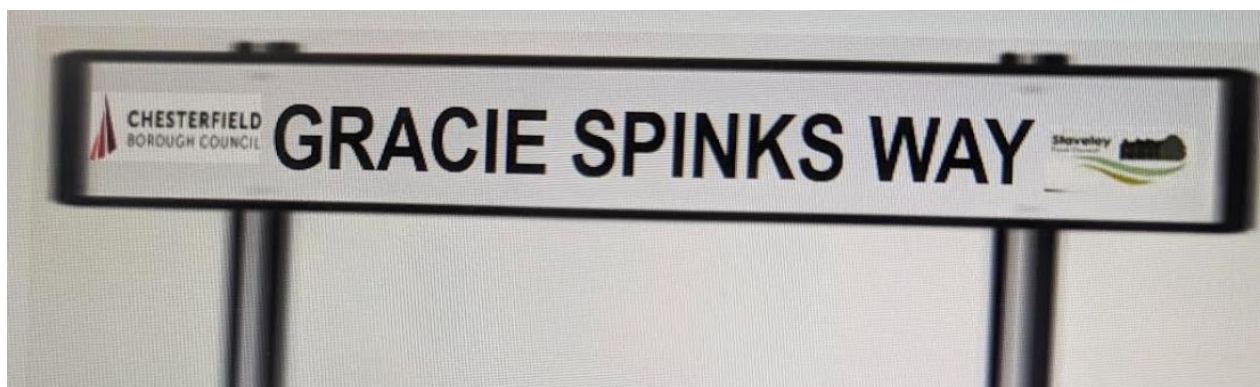
Renaming this footpath will help emergency services to respond quicker and locate anyone in the event of any incident.

I am pleased that after months of work I have got the approval from Gracie's Family, Chesterfield Borough Council and Derbyshire County Council officers, But all that is needed now is the approval of Members present to Grant the finances needed from CIL as per detailed in this report.

I hope that members will support this request so that we can give the young girl and her family something back as an appreciation of what they have and are doing for us and our community.
